Quick Response

"Blessed be the Lord, for he has heard the sound of my pleadings. The Lord is my strength and my shield; in him my heart trusts; so I am helped, and my heart exults, and with my song I give thanks to him." (Psalm 28:6-7, NRSV)

As Hurricane Matthew pummeled Haiti and then headed north toward the eastern seaboard, many people immediately began to ask how they might help. Even though this is one more disaster in a long line of disasters including winter storms, wildfires, flooding, tornadoes, and hurricanes, people are always eager to help.

There are three organizations that we immediately turn to when a disaster strikes. The North Alabama Annual Conference of the UMC has a disaster response team, the Southeastern Jurisdiction of the UMC has the Volunteers in Mission organization, and the United Methodist Church has the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). All three of these agencies work closely with the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Red Cross, and any local Emergency Management Agencies in the affected areas to coordinate a response. This coordination actually begins prior to any known threat so that a quick response is ensured.

Each of the Christian denominations has a coordinated role to play in the process of responding to natural disasters. For instance, the Southern Baptists are usually the first in the area providing hot meals for those affected. Specialized teams from all denominations are called in after the Emergency Personnel have completed the three day to three week Disaster Response phase. It is in this time that trained chain saw crews (who have been trained and certified) or flood bucket crews come in to begin the cleanup of the area.

Then comes the Disaster Recovery phase, and this is where United Methodists and the Mennonites shine. From caseload management to repair and construction, these two denominations carry the bulk of the work of recovery for as long as it takes. Working with FEMA grants as well as with private donations, we help people file the necessary paperwork for long-term recovery and home repair funds. Then we help rebuild. After Hurricane Katrina, there were still United Methodist and Mennonite work teams in the area six and seven years after the initial disaster.

As a United Methodist Church member, you can be proud of the way your church responds to those whose lives have been turned upside down by a natural disaster. We're truly there for the long haul, representing the love of Jesus Christ in the lives of those who need to know that God has heard their cries for help.
