




Next Sunday is Gideon Sunday!

Spiritual Beings in Search of **Becoming More Human**

"And being found in human form, [Jesus] humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross." (Philippians 2:8, NRSV)

Jesus was both fully divine and fully human. This statement is a theological paradox. We can only affirm it through faith. In his full humanity, Jesus lived a perfect life. In doing so, he showed us the possibilities of our humanity. Most of us use the fact that we are humans as an excuse for our inability to be fully obedient to God. We act as if our humanity is a limiting factor. It is not.

I think our confusion comes from the perspective we take about "what" kind of beings we are. Most of us see ourselves as human beings in search of becoming more spiritual. In reality, we are spiritual beings in search of becoming more human. By "more human," I mean it in the sense that Jesus' life represents the fullest expression of humanity. I like the way C.S. Lewis put it:

"You don't have a soul. You are a soul. You have a body." - C.S. Lewis

Your soul is "who" you are. Your soul is the essence of you. Your soul is the being-ness that lies at the core of you. It just so happens that your soul is clothed in a body in the same way your body is clothed in the garments you wear. You are NOT your clothes. You are NOT your body. You ARE your soul. It is in your eternal soul (or your eternal being) that you can connect to the eternal God.

Through this soul connection with the eternal God, we discover God's intention for how we are to interact in this world—this is also known as God's will for our lives. By paying attention to our souls, we get a glimpse of how God wants us to live. Then we are challenged to embody God's will through our humanity in the same way Jesus embodied God's will in his body. This embodiment is the process of becoming more human.

When we neglect our souls, we are choosing to ignore God's will for us. We fall prey to our will, to our desires, and to our selfishness, and we become less human. We hurt others. We minimize our relationships. And we suffer from a diminished life.

God's will is never meant to diminish our lives. As a matter of fact, God's will for us always leads to the fullest expression of who we are in all of our beauty and creativity. Fulfilling God's will is not as much about sacrifice as it is about finding the fullness of life that God intends for us to have. In union with God, as Christ was in union with God, we are obedient to God and become the best humans that we can be.
