Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.*

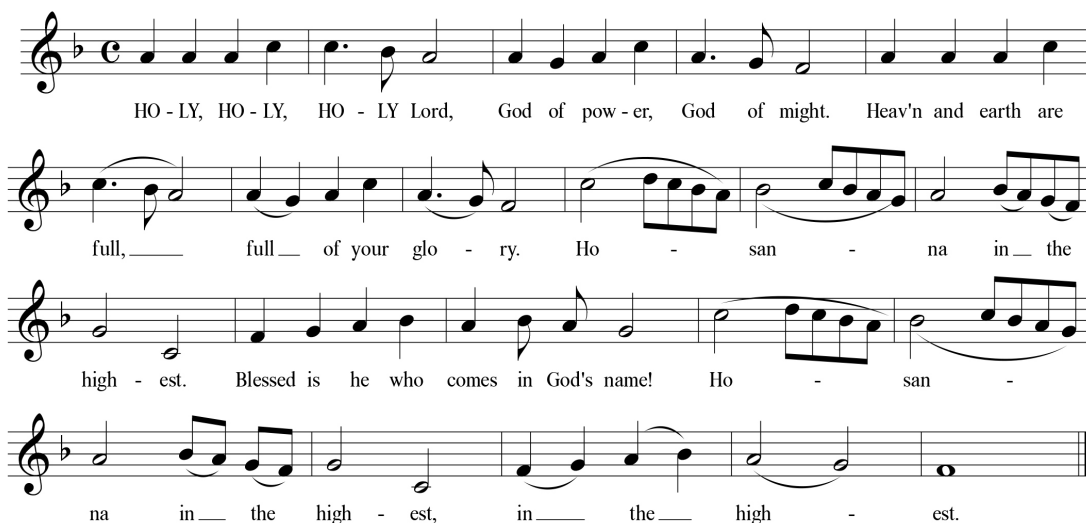
Your people who have walked in darkness have seen a great light;
